These pledges of capital support were made at an early stage in the planning of the new waterfront gallery by Fort William and Port Arthur Rotary Clubs. Port Arthur Rotary's 2021 announcement making the Thunder Bay Art Gallery's new Waterfront home their Centennial Project. In 2019 Fort William Rotary Club pledged \$100,000 in support through the Fort William Rotary Club's annual House Lottery.
